FACEBOOK ACCOUNT HACKED?

All too often you receive a Facebook friend request from someone you already know is your friend. Or, you get a message from a friend informing you that they have received a friend request that you did not send. Getting hacked is frustrating to say the least. Below are some ways to protect your Facebook account. Remember you can report any fake or hacked accounts at facebook.com/hacked.

- Set up two-factor authentication. Add extra security to receive alerts from unrecognized logins. Both are found in your account's settings page.
- Change your password often and make it long. Create a phrase or sentence. The longer the password, the longer it takes a hacker to crack it.
- Search for your own name on Facebook and see if a second account appears that you did not create. Hackers like to clone accounts by snipping pictures from your account and adding your information. If you find a fake account, report it.
- Never accept a friend request from an unknown person or a friend without verifying the request.
